
Doors open at 6:00 PM that night at Martin Luther King Elementary School with service starting at 6:30 PM.

#### ELECTRONIC VILLAGE AND V-TECH LAB

WHAT IS IT? WHAT HAPPENED TO IT? IS IT STILL RUNNING?

These and many more questions are asked of me often! Since the resignation of Dug Steen the V-tech lab has been virtually non-existent. Dug was a big asset to this program; he basically ran the whole show himself. The Committee Chairperson and Committee seemed to have all but disappeared. This has left the Community Council in a bind. So once again we are asking for your help to get The Electronic Village and V-Tech lab open and operating successfully.

The Electronic Village and V-Tech lab is a great program, and is an opportunity for the community to learn about and have access to computers! Adults can get training to familiarize themselves with computers, students can use the computers to do their homework, and increase their skills.

I have asked Sarah Ford to help us put together a new committee for this project so we can get someone hired to replace Dug Steen. 

#### RECIPE OF THE MONTH - WILTED LETTUCE

This is one of those old-timey recepies that come in handy when you don't want to cook up a huge meal:

leaf lettuce 1 tsp sugar (optional) 5 or 6 slices of bacon 1/4 cup wine vinegar black pepper (optional) 4 or 5 green onions

Tear lettuce into salad bowl. Cook bacon until crisp. Remove from pan, dry on paper towel and crush into bits. Add finely cut green onions, sugar, and vinegar to pan, bring to boil. Pour over greens and sprinkle with bacon bits. Toss. Serve at once. Serves 4. Very good with crusty bread.

Dear Neighbor,

We are writing to ask for your help in what may become a ground-breaking project benefiting the children and families in the Greater Madison Valley and south Capitol Hill area.

The Martin Luther King Elementary School, the Meany Middle School, and the Bush School are interested in exploring the possibility of establishing a formal cooperative relationship in a public school/private school/community partnership.

Tentatively named the "<u>Village Schools Partnership</u>", this cooperative relationship could benefit all children, families, and communities involved by:

- sharing ideas and resources between the schools
- providing greater opportunities for parent and community involvement in the schools
- assisting the schools' staffs and Site Councils in their restructuring and strategic planning to build world class community schools
- bringing access to greater resources to benefit the schools and their respective communities
- providing an opportunity for supporters of public and private schools to help dispel the
  myths that we have about each other and find common ground in our mutual interest in
  the education of all children.

We hope to spend 1997 talking with individuals like yourself in our efforts to get as many diverse points of view as possible to assist us in the planning process and in our decision if and how to proceed with building this partnership project.

To assist in the planning, we have submitted a grant request for funding to the Seattle Department of Neighborhoods this fall. The grant format requires that we document "pledges" of volunteer time that will be spent on the planning effort during the 1997.

Would you be willing to spend up to 2 hours during the 1997 to meet with one of our planning committee members to share your thoughts, and to respond to questions that we will have about the community's response to this concept? Do you know any other individuals who we should contact who may have ideas to share about how to build a partnership like this?
